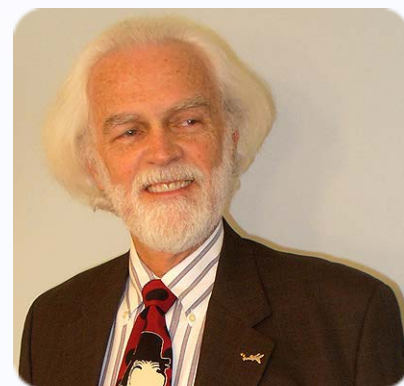

**LIGHTEN UP! HUMOR IS FUNDAMENTAL TO PROVIDING QUALITY CARE AND EDUCATION TO YOUNG CHILDREN**

*Keynote Speaker: Dr. Paul McGhee*

This keynote is entertaining and fun, but substantive, as well. It focuses on how keeping your sense of humor helps childcare providers and early childhood educators provide quality care and education day after day—even on the tough days. A good sense of humor is emphasized as an essential (emotional) survival skill for childcare providers, helping to provide the resilience needed to cope with the challenges that young children sometimes provide. The key to humor's ability to boost emotional resilience will be shown to be its ability to generate a strong positive emotion within you . . . even when you're having a tough day. This resilience is even more important in the midst of continuing COVID uncertainty and challenges.

During this session, participants will examine the ages and stages of media literacy for children under the age eight through a lens of developmentally appropriate use of media and technology in accordance with COMAR screen time policies. Through large group discussions and small group activities, participants will explore the purpose of traditional and digital media, and use MPT's step-by-step framework, Media STEPs for Learning, to build activity plans as they identify and align learning goals with trusted content from PBS KIDS.

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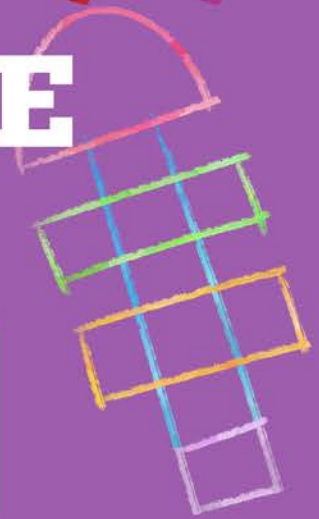
